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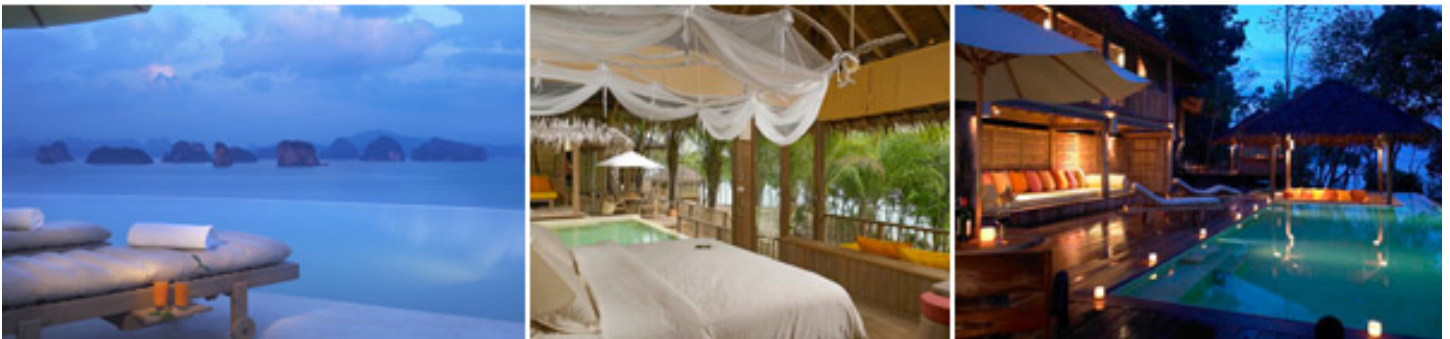
Evason Hideway's Latest Resort in Thailand — Yao Noi

World Heritage Sites — Indonesia

This month, our UNESCO list features Indonesia, with its seven World Heritage sites:

Borobudur Temple Compounds, Java

This famous Buddhist temple, dating from the 8th and 9th centuries, was built in three tiers: a pyramidal base with five concentric square terraces, the trunk of a cone with three circular platforms and, at the top, a monumental stupa.

Prambanan Temple Compounds, Java

Built in the 10th century, this is the largest Hindu temple compound dedicated to Shiva in Indonesia.

Ujung Kulon National Park, Java

This national park includes the Ujung Kulon peninsula and several offshore islands and encompasses the natural reserve of Krakatoa. Several species of endangered plants and animals can be found there, including the seriously threatened Javan rhinoceros.

Komodo National Park, nr. Lesser Sunda Islands

These volcanic islands are inhabited by a population of around 5,700 giant lizards, whose appearance and aggressive behavior have led to them being called 'Komodo dragons.' They exist nowhere else in the world and are of great interest to scientists studying the theory of evolution.

Sangiran Early Man Site, Java

Excavations here from 1936 to 1941 led to the discovery of the first hominid fossil at this site. Later, 50 fossils of *Meganthropus palaeo* and *Pithecanthropus erectus*/Homo erectus were found here.

Lorentz National Park, New Guinea

The only protected area in the world to incorporate a continuous, intact transect from snowcap to tropical marine environment, including extensive lowland wetlands.

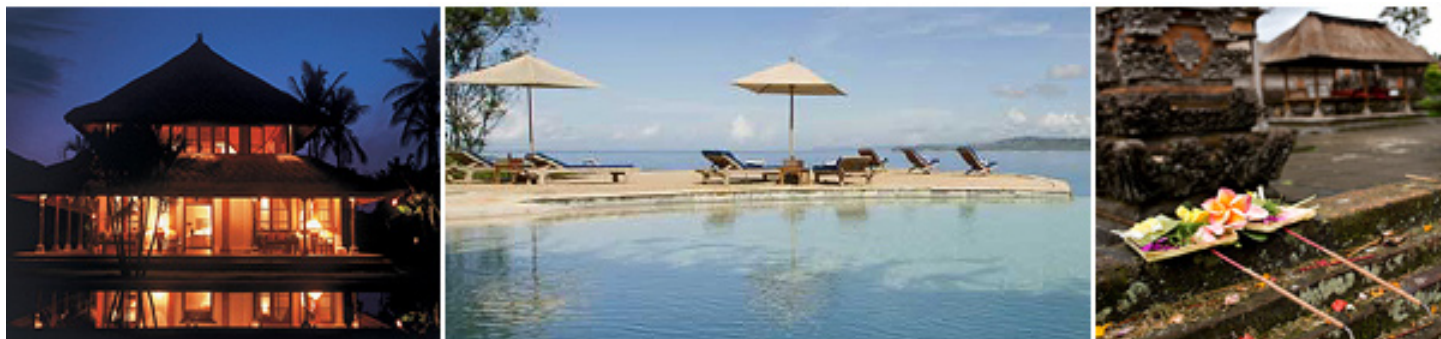
Tropical Rainforest Heritage, Sumatra

Comprising three national parks, this site holds the greatest potential for long-term conservation of the distinctive and diverse biota of Sumatra, including many endangered species.
