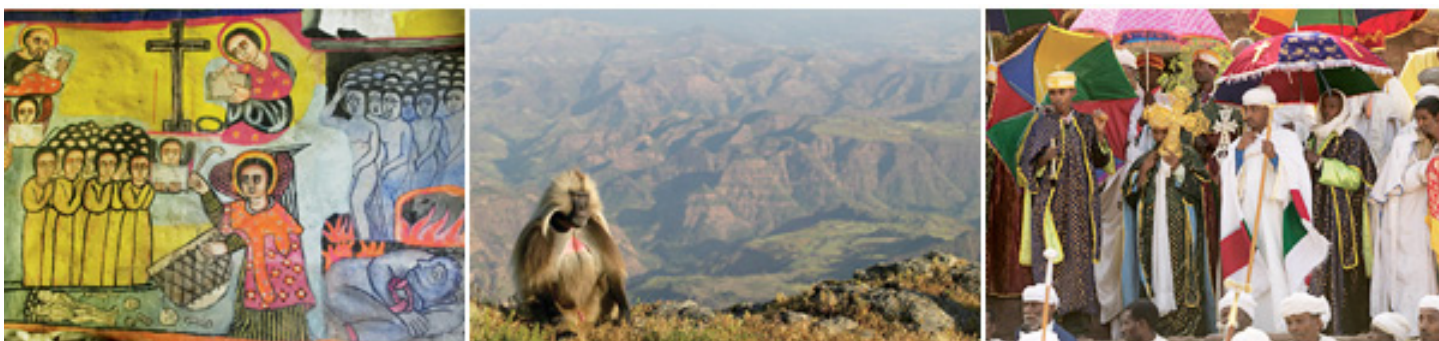

Iguaçu National Park

Iguaçu is one of the world’s largest and most impressive waterfalls, extending over some 8,858 ft. It is home to many rare and endangered species of flora and fauna, among them the giant otter and the giant anteater.

Salvador de Bahia

As the first capital of Brazil, the city became a blend of European, African and Amerindian cultures. A special feature of the old town are its brightly colored houses, often decorated with fine stucco-work.

Pantanal Conservation Area

The site represents 1.3% of Brazil’s Pantanal region, one of the world’s largest freshwater wetland ecosystems.

The Central Amazon

Makes up the largest protected area in the Amazon Basin (over 6 million hectares) and is one of the planet’s richest regions in terms of biodiversity. The site protects key threatened species, including giant arapaima fish, the Amazonian manatee, the black caiman and two species of river dolphin.

Ouro Preto

Founded at the end of the 17th C, Ouro Preto (Black Gold) was the focal point of the gold rush and Brazil’s golden age in the 18th C.
